Saint Faustina was born Helena Kowalska in a small village west of Lodz, Poland on August 25, 1905. When she was almost twenty, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, whose members devote themselves to the care and education of troubled young women. In the 1930's, Sister Faustina received from the Lord a message of mercy that she was told to spread throughout the world. Jesus said "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature 'Jesus, I trust in you.'" (Diary 47) Jesus then said "I promise that the soul which will venerate this image will not perish." At her canonization Pope JP2 said, "Sister Mary Faustina, an apostle of the Divine Mercy, belongs today to the group of the most popular and well-known saints of the Church. Through her the Lord Jesus communicates to the world the great message of God's mercy and reveals the pattern of Christian perfection based on trust in God and on the attitude of mercy toward one's neighbors."

The Holy Father also said: “The mission of Sister Mary Faustina consists in 3 tasks:– reminding the world of the truth of our faith revealed in the Holy Scripture about the merciful love of God toward every human being.– Entreating God's mercy for the whole world and particularly for sinners, among others through the practice of new forms of devotion to the Divine Mercy presented by the Lord Jesus, such as: the veneration of the image of the Divine Mercy with the inscription: *Jesus, I Trust in You*, the feast of the Divine Mercy celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter, chaplet to the Divine Mercy and prayer at the Hour of Mercy (3 p.m.). The Lord Jesus attached great promises to the above forms of devotion, provided one entrusted one's life to God and practiced active love of one's neighbor. – The third task in Sr. Mary Faustina's mission consists in initiating the apostolic movement of the Divine Mercy which undertakes the task of proclaiming and entreating God's mercy for the world and strives for Christian perfection, following the precepts laid down by the Blessed Sr. Mary Faustina. The precepts in question require the faithful to display an attitude of child-like trust in God which expresses itself in fulfilling His will, as well as in the attitude of mercy toward one's neighbors.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

"There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited." John 2:1

Jesus raised marriage between a husband and a wife to the dignity of a sacrament. In the Sacrament of Matrimony, a baptized man and a baptized woman give themselves to each other for mutual love and to bear children. The bride and groom are the ministers of marriage. They give themselves to each other in love. The Church holds that the exchange of consent, where the partners mutually give themselves to one another, is the indispensable element of marriage. It is this mutual consent that makes the marriage.



A priest or deacon serves as a witness. Every marriage involving a Catholic must be performed in the presence of a priest or deacon. The couple is married in Church. The Rite of Marriage can take place during a Nuptial (wedding) Mass or outside of Mass. The Rite offers choices for readings, the prayers, the form of the marriage vows and music. The couple should plan the ceremony with the priest or deacon in advance.

Marriage Preparation

Couples are encouraged to prepare for marriage by participating in a marriage preparation course, private instruction, "marriage encounter" weekends for engaged couples or a pre-Cana course. These programs usually have qualified presenters. Professionals in special fields and married couples give sessions on communication, psychology, financing, family planning, the Church's teachings, the Sacrament

of Matrimony and celebrating the wedding. Catholics are required to participate in marriage preparation sessions in some dioceses. Individual dioceses have their own guidelines regarding marriage. In the United States, Catholics preparing for marriage should check with their parish priest about specifics.
