The Sacrament of Reconciliation is also known as:

- Sacrament of Penance
- Sacrament of Peace
- Sacrament of Forgiveness
- Sacrament of Conversion
- Confession.

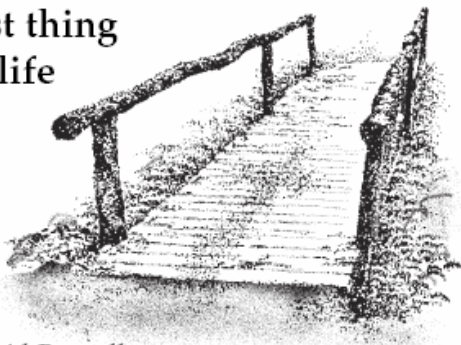
To receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

- Examine your conscience (think of your sins)
- Be sorry for your sins (make an act of contrition)
- Have a firm purpose of amendment (promise not to sin again)
- Confess your sins to a priest (tell your sins to the priest)
- Perform the penance the priest gives you (say the prayer or do the good work).

The Spiritual Effects of the Sacrament:

- Reconciliation with God
- The restoration of grace
- Reconciliation with the Church
- Forgiveness of sin
- Remission of punishment due to mortal sin
- Pardon, in part, of temporal punishment due to sin
- Peace of conscience
- An increase of spiritual strength
- Spiritual solace.
