## THE STORY OF OUR REDEMPTION

*We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.*

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

*Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.*

*Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.*

## **April 14, 2019      Scripture Reflections**

**Today's readings for Palm Sunday highlight the resolve of God's servant to fulfill his will.**

**In the First Reading , the "servant " speaks. This is the third of four servant oracles in the Book of Isaiah. The servant goes unnamed, but he is depicted as freely giving over his will to God. Here we are told that he did not refuse when God opened his ear to hear what a disciple needs to know, and he set his face like flint to do God's will, knowing that God would not allow him to be put to shame.**

**The Second Reading invites us to join our voices in praise of the Christ who emptied himself to take on the form of a slave and accept death on a cross. Because of his openness to God's will, he is exalted above every other name in the universe, but Paul situates the hymn in an admonition, "Having among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus." Thus, we are called to join our lives to the self-emptying of Christ.**

**Today's Gospel recounts the story of Jesus' passion and death as told by Luke, beginning with the Passover meal that he shared with his disciples to his burial by Joseph of Arimathea. But his journey to death began much earlier in Luke's Gospel account. In Luke 9:51, we are told, "When the days for when his being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem." Indeed, Jesus' life was oriented to the Paschal Mystery, the process of dying and rising to new life. As his disciples, we are called to do the same.**

- Ask God to open your heart to more deeply ponder and give thanks for Christ's self emptying.**

The Church's official Easter celebration is the Easter Vigil on Saturday night.


**The themes of the ceremony focus on LIGHT that drives out darkness and WATER that brings new life. Christ is seen as the light of the world. At the ceremony, a large candle represents Christ. It is carried into darkened Church at the beginning, All present have received smaller candles and they are lit from the Christ Candle to show what can happen to a dark world when Christ enters with His own message of peace and meaningful life of love. It is called the Paschal or "Passover" Candle—the passage from one life to another. This is what Lent is all about—Easter and New Life!**

### Restoration of the Chalice at Mass for the Faithful

At the center of the Church's annual liturgical calendar is the commemoration of the Lord's death and resurrection during the Three Days. Lent will end late in the afternoon of Thursday, April 18. The Three Days will begin this Thursday evening, April 18, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. As the Church enters the sacred Triduum, the offering of the chalice is to be restored in all the parishes of the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown. At the Mass of the Lord's Supper all in the Diocesan Church will be welcomed to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord under the species of bread and wine. Consistently the Church has stated that the fullness of the sign of Mass is seen in the reception of both the consecrated bread and the consecrated wine. This is what Jesus the Lord directed on the night before he died, to eat his Body and drink his Blood. All are invited to receive Holy Communion under the elements of both bread and wine Holy Thursday evening. Also, beginning at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we will now return to the regular manner of exchanging the sign of peace.
