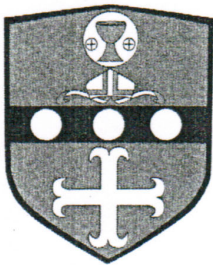

Dear Father Zatalava and the faith community of Our Lady of Fatima,

The Year of Grace 2011 is upon us. We, as God's People of the Church of Altoona-Johnstown, have reason to be profoundly grateful! In April, we will welcome our eighth Diocesan Bishop in the person of Bishop-elect Mark L. Bartchak. In May, we will celebrate 110 years since Pope Leo XIII established what was, then, the Diocese of Altoona. But, before we embrace these joyful occasions, I humbly ask for your support of the diocesan ministries that serve each of our faith communities in various ways.

Once again, it is time to ask your assistance through the Annual Catholic Appeal. Pledging your sacrificial gift within the context of your Lenten journey will afford you an opportunity to reflect on the blessings that have been particularly yours. That expression of gratitude on your part will be a gift that will have an impact on countless others in Jesus' name.

On another level, your support will place our Diocese on a sound financial standing before Bishop Bartchak's arrival. This will allow him to focus on the spiritual and pastoral needs of God's People in these Allegheny Mountains, before addressing the Annual Catholic Appeal next year.

The Diocesan ACA assessment of \$2.6 million dollars is several thousand dollars less than last year's target. This is a result of a decrease in offertory throughout the Diocese. Please be assured that diocesan ministerial budgets are being reduced accordingly.

Your parish's ACA Goal of \$15,636 represents six-tenths of one percent of the Diocesan total. All contributions received above the parish goal will be returned to your parish for its particular needs.

Know that you remain in my prayers always, trusting that I will remain in yours. May you continue to be abundantly blessed, as our Diocesan Church continues its pilgrimage into the Reign of God under the new Bishop that our Lord has designated for us.

The Pastor's KISS Column (Keep It Short & Simple)

I'm assuming that all of us intellectually appreciate the fact that when we of O.L.F. celebrate Our Mass, we are incorporated into and united with not only every Mass celebrated in the County and the Country, and not only to and with every Mass said anywhere and everywhere in the world, but also united with and incorporated into that Mass which all the Saints of every time and every place celebrate constantly in Heaven. Pope John Paul II was fond of saying: "The Mass is heaven on earth."

I must confess that during a lot of Masses I was not continuously conscious of that profoundly far reaching reality. Now, I am, a lot more so. And, Latin is the reason. Latin is the language of antiquity, so, strategically placed, it makes us conscious of, and puts us in touch with all the Saints. Latin is the OFFICIAL language of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church founded by Jesus Christ, so, strategically placed, it makes us conscious of, and puts us in touch with all those living persons world wide who are celebrating Mass with us. Sing it with me: Kyrie, Sanctus, Agnus Dei, Pater Noster. Use the guides and practice a little bit at home.

Quoting Vatican II documents the last four Popes have pushed for the use of SOME Latin in the English Mass. And now we, at least I, know why. It really works!
