# To be, or not to be? That is the question.



## To keep O.L.F. open, or to close it? That is the dilemma.

#### Reflections of the Pastor concerning if or how it makes a difference.

A couple of weeks ago three parishioners called in quick succession to ask me if I had been watching the local T.V. news account of the closing of a parish over in Johnstown. Since for a variety of reasons I had the Cable disconnected at the Rectory about a year ago, I answered: "No, I wasn't." In each instance I barely had the words out of my mouth when each asked the same second question: "Are we next?"

I'm not proud of the (what my brother would call) typically smart-alecky J.D. answer I gave to each caller. I said: "You are in a much better position to answer that than I am." My message was accurate, but it should have been phrased more delicately. No matter how much finger pointing any of us may do we must all eventually admit the truth of what Cassius said: "The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our stars, but in ourselves, that we are underlings." Shakespeare is telling us that we are in the fix we're in because of what we are or aren't doing, ourselves. In sixteen words the Bard summarizes Saint Paul's ten versus: "Romans 7:15 What I do, I do not understand. For I do not do what I want, but I do what I hate. 16 Now if I do what I do not want, I concur that the law is good. 17 So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. 18 For I know that good does not dwell in me, that is, in my flesh. The willing is ready at hand, but doing the good is not. 19 For I do not do the good I want, but I do the evil I do not want. 20 Now if (I) do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. 21 So, then, I discover the principle that when I want to do right, evil is at hand. 22 For I take delight in the law of God, in my inner self, 23 but I see in my members another principle at war with the law of my mind, taking me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. 24 Miserable one that I am! Who will deliver me from this mortal body? 25 Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord. Therefore, I myself, with my mind, serve the law of God but, with my flesh, the law of sin."

Given that most of the individual Catholic people currently served by Our Lady of Fatima will continue to have relatively ready access to the basic package the culture of Catholicism has to offer, I thought, in the biggest picture possible it didn't much matter whether O.L.F. survived or not. However, after several hours of Eucharistic Adoration a new and different image began developing in my soul. It became clearer and clearer that Jesus wants his Real Presence, as the Eucharist, really present in the Fifth Ward of Altoona. OLF is not just a meeting place where subscribers to an ill-defined notion of some generic deity gather to kowtow to an impersonal projection of some psychopath's fertile imagination. OLF is where the divinely revealed Son of God, Jesus Christ, Body and Blood - Soul and Divinity, really lives in the Fifth Ward. It's not our hall in the Fifth Ward. It's His house in the Fifth Ward.

It's pretty obvious that I want OLF to not only survive but to thrive. In fact (inside back page)
