OLF joins other parishes in making adjustments to new PA Lottery Rules

You can't fight City Hall is an old and perpetually valid dictum. It's a long and convoluted story but the bottom line is that legally we can no longer practically use the Lotto Daily Numbers as the index for our private small games of chance fund raising activities. Personally, I think this should be a "Catholic" wedge issue for the next election. Why can't they just leave us alone? Gambling laws, rules, and regulations are (or should be) made to control the big money gangster types, not struggling (mostly Catholic) Churches. (And please - let's leave *the "scandal"* out of this.) It's not my role to do the politics thing ... but it is yours. I don't view myself as a "Tea Partier" but I do like the sound of their rally cry - "Let's take back our government ."

Well, apparently, a little pressure applied in the right places (and sometimes in the Left places as well, actually pays off. This week our State Senator - JOHN H. EICHELBERGER, JR. of PA 's 30TH DISTRICT - released an e-mail stating in part :

"We've had many calls in the office about this issue." "We're pleased to see the extension from the Department of Revenue to help our local social clubs." "There will be no annual report required for social clubs in 2014. Those that have a liquor license and record small games of chance proceeds of \$20,000 or more will be required to follow the new requirements starting in February 2015.

"The annual report requirement has been permanently eliminated for all organizations that do not have liquor licenses."

For us at O.L.F. all this legalese simply means that we can return to our previous way of doing business with regard to the parish co-op. We will in fact be back in business selling for March drawings during the month of February. Tickets are being printed as we read!

Thanks to all those who "put pressure" on our legislators and on the regulatory system in the Commonwealth.

Thanks to the bureaucrats who retain a listening ear to their constituencies.

Now, if only we could get similar effects in dealing with the Government in regard to preserving the lives of the unborn. We've been marching around Washington for one day annually for forty years with little effect beyond keeping alive a presence and an awareness that the people are concerned, sort of, about the issue of abortion, and then it's back to business as usual. We need new approaches to *really* pressure the governing classes. I'll pray. You strategize.
