## JULY 10, 2016 Scripture Reflection

The familiar parable of the Good Samaritan always catches our attention and leads us to examine our conscience. The "scholar of the law" is testing Jesus, hoping to expose a flaw. But Jesus uses the opportunity to teach a lesson the scholar does not anticipate. When Jesus invites him to share his interpretation, he quotes the great summary of the law in Deuteronomy 6:4. Later in that chapter Moses will point out what we hear in the First Reading--that the law is not complex or remote. In other words, one should not need a "scholar of the law" to understand it, because it is "already in your mouths and in your hearts." It is a matter of the heart, not the intellect.

In Jesus' parable, those capable and obligated to help (the priest and the Levite) pass by the helpless victim. The Samaritan, who is not obligated to give assistance, does. The point of the encounter in Jesus' parable is the difference between knowing and doing. Knowing the law is one thing; actually living it is another. The compassion of the Samaritan is not rooted in the law or social conventions; it is simply and act of human decency that responds to the situation from the heart.

The Samaritan had an inner source for his action. Jesus connects it with the love of God found in the commandment quoted by the scholar, the love already in the outcast Samaritan's heart. Jesus redistributes the weight of the law, emphasizing love over knowledge. A modern-day paraphrase might be that the love of God and love of neighbor is our spiritual DNA. It's what defines us as disciples. The scholar receives an answer to his question. We don't know what the scholar did after that; we do know what we must do.


