This year, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, Sunday, June 22, will mark the closing of our diocesan period of National Eucharistic Revival. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the Cathedral for adoration following the 10:00 A.M. Mass. Then, at 3:00–4:15 P.M. priests will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. At 3:00 P.M. there will be a Holy Hour for Vocations, and at 4:00 P.M. the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed for those who have fallen away from the Church. **At 4:15 P.M. Bishop Mark will conduct an indoor Eucharistic Procession which will be followed by Benediction. The Bishop will celebrate 5:00 P.M. Mass for the closing of the National Eucharistic Revival.** Refreshments will be served in our hall following Mass. Since this is a diocesan event, priests, deacons, religious, and lay representatives from throughout the diocese will be present. Bishop Mark extends a special invitation to all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Altar Servers, and 2025 First Communicants from around the diocese to be recognized at the closing Mass.

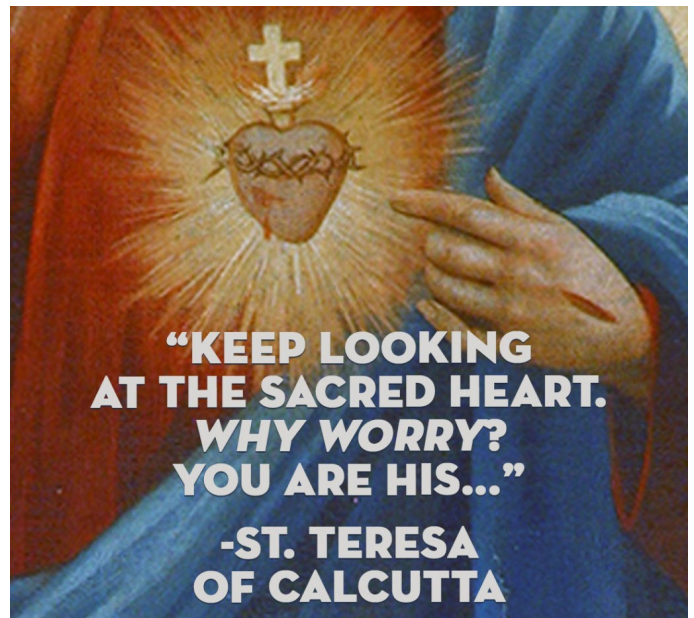
