Altoona-Johnstown Annual Catholic Appeal Formula and Consequences

- All parishes cumulative regular receipts for FY 2006-2007 = \$23,754,736.00
- 11% of that total = \$2,613,021.00 which is the 2008 ACA Diocesan Goal
- The Goal (\$2,613,021.00) divided by 41,414 which is the number of households in the diocese
- = \$63.10 which is the assessment per household for each household in the diocese
- \$63.10 times 180 (taxable) households in Our Lady of Fatima Parish = our Parish Goal of \$11,358.00

If we lived in an ideal parish in an ideal world, each of our 180 households would pledge \$63.10 (making 7 equal payments of \$9.02 each.) We all know that isn't going to happen. Some few can't, most who don't, simply won't. Those who are able to, have to carry our brothers. I, your assigned pastor (and not a registered member,) have pledged \$631.00 (\$90.14 per month for 7 months) to carry 10 of our weak links.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church
