WASHINGTON (JDZ) – E.W.T.N.'s Raymond Arroyo, the 6th annual breakfast's Master of Ceremonies, introduced the 1,300 gathered Catholics to both Supreme Court's respective Justices: Justice Antonin Scalia, Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court and Archbishop Raymond L. Burke, Prefect of the Supreme Court of the Apostolic Signature at the Vatican.

Scalia, a Catholic Justice, whose priest son gave the invocation, urged members of the audience to have the courage to practice their faith proudly, even when others ridicule or trivialize the virgin birth of Jesus and his Resurrection as anything but miracles. He said he has heard people in "educated circles" say that traditional Catholics "are poorly educated and easily led," but told the audience to hold on to their faith and "have the courage to suffer the contempt of the sophisticated world."

The Associate Justice recounted at some length the history of his favorite Saint, Sir Thomas More. He suggested that today's Catholics would greatly benefit from watching the video, **A Man for All Seasons**.

"Roma locuta est, causa finita est," *

The Archbishop delivered such a tour de force that current space allows only for bulleted highlights. After having established his credentials as a patriotic American Catholic Cleric he made eminently clear the fact that his words and his voice "come from Rome." ... such clever subtlety. And, now the bullets:

* "Rome has spoken, the matter is finished."

- Burke called the prospect of the University of Notre Dame granting this "President" an honorary degree "the source of the greatest scandal," and questioned the Indiana institution's Catholic identity for honoring a politician who supports legal abortion.
- Expressed his disapproval that a majority of U.S. Catholic voters cast their ballot for an anti-life and anti-family candidate in last November's election and said they should reflect on the direction the country has taken since he has been in office. He mentioned a policy that allows funding for overseas family planning groups that provide abortions and moves by several states to make same-sex marriage legal.
- Called on U.S. Catholics to have "open eyes to the gravity of the situation in our nation" and to be "clear and uncompromising" in a mission of ridding the country of the "great evils of contraception and so-called same-sex marriage."
- Spent much time denouncing "The President's" support for legal abortion and embryonic stem-cell research and Catholic politicians who vote for "anti-family" legislation, such as same-sex marriage.
- Said Catholic schools and universities must not honor those who push an agenda that goes against moral law, adding that any university that would give this President an honorary degree is "not worthy of the name Catholic."
- Said it is patriotic to vote based on Catholic values.
- Said nothing could justify casting a ballot for a candidate who supports "anti-life" and "anti-family" legislation, which he deemed "cooperation in evil."

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, he called on members of the audience to pray the rosary and not to get discouraged in their fight to reverse the nation's "culture of death."
