Through the generosity of both parishioners and non-parishioners we find ourselves in a position where we can comfortably complete what should be the last phase of our interior renovation: that being the finishing of the carpeting of the church floor. The deterioration of the present carpeting compels us to act now. Obviously we are not talking about the recently re-carpeted Sanctuary area. We are talking about the vestibule, the back of the church, the three aisles, and the front of the church below the step-up into the Sanctuary. Once begun the whole job should take less than 10 days to complete, probably in early June. Color, fabric and texture decisions were left in the hands of an ad hoc advisory panel of parishioners who have proven themselves to be knowledgeable in these matters. As part of the project all pews will be equally spaced, tightly secured to the floor, and where required smoothed out. The color chosen is named Charcoal. It appears to be somewhere between Gray and Navy and provides a really nice compatible contrast with the various Blues in our Worship Space.
