The OLF Fundraising Committee has opened discussion on, and begun investigation of, the possibility, practicality, and feasibility of having a really big (possibly annual) Arts & Crafts Festival modeled after (and perhaps even, rivaling) similar events held in Bedford, Ligonier, Johnstown, State College and hundreds of comparably sized communities throughout the nation. If we still own it then, the venue proposed is St. Leo's Camp. If we've already sold the property, we could have an understanding/agreement with the new owners that we get to use the site for this three day (?) event each year. For a variety of reasons it was assumed that the best time for this event would be late summer, beginning in 2009 (or perhaps, more realistically, 2010.) As the *vision* became clearer during the conversation, it also became apparent that the project would not be a *back-breaking-labor-intensive* effort for the parishioners [invited vendors do all their own work], but would require the cerebral talents of skilled planners, organizers, administrators, negotiators, publicists, and silver-tongued-sales-people manning the phones and the Internet. **Right now**, immediately, we need several volunteers experienced in compiling a Project Master Plan who will prepare a day-by-day, step-by-step, contact-by-contact, problem-by-problem prospectus for presentation to the parish by way of the Council. Step Forward. Share your brain power talents with you fellow parishioners. Call the Rectory.

Casual conversation with several parishioners and serious discussion with our Realtor have resulted in the conception of the following proposal: What if we sold the St. Leo Camp site to a syndicate, consortium, association, or corporation (created for that purpose) instead of to a single individual or family.
