The Theology of Indulgences ... Victor R. Claveau, MJ

There are few doctrines of the Catholic Church that have been more grossly misrepresented by Protestant writers than the doctrine of Indulgence. A common opinion of our non-Catholic friends is that an indulgence means not only the full pardon of sins committed but also a license to commit further sins. They allege, moreover, that the most essential condition for obtaining an indulgence is the payment to a priest of a certain sum of money. Nothing could be further from the truth. An indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to those sins of which the guilt has been forgiven, either in the sacrament of Penance or because of an act of perfect contrition, granted by the competent ecclesiastical authority out of the Church's Treasury of Merits. to the living by way of absolution, to the dead by way of suffrage. It is called temporal because, whether endured in this world or the next, it will last only for a time in contrast to the eternal punishment of hell, which every serious sin deserves. The liability to eternal punishment that attaches itself to serious sin ceases as soon as the sin itself is effaced from the soul.
