Scripture Reflection

The lot of the prophet is a dismal one. Jeremiah often laments his call, wishing he hadn't been born. He is derided by the people and cursed. He's commanded not to marry or have a family. He is thrown into a cistern and left to die. And eventually, he will be dragged to Egypt. Today's reading recounts the origin of Jeremiah's call. Even before his birth, God had dedicated Jeremiah as a prophet to the nations. God will place the word in his mouth and make of the prophet a pillar of iron, a wall of brass against the land. Today's Gospel follows that of last Sunday when Jesus read from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. The listeners' response is ambiguous. First they speak favorably about him, but soon the mood changes and they expel him from the town. They take offense when he reminds them of their history of faithlessness to the Word of God. After all, he is one of them; how dare he chastise them? By recounting this story near the beginning of Jesus' ministry, Luke alerts us to the opposing reactions that Jesus' message and mission will receive as he continues to preach the Word of God in their midst.

The scripture to which Jesus refers announces the ultimate age of fulfillment. It provides a glimpse into the kind of Messiah that Jesus will be, namely one who will refresh society for the sake of the oppressed. Here Jesus insists that God even goes beyond the confines of Israel into the territory of the Gentiles. This filled the people in the synagogue with fury. To think that the prophetic promise of fulfillment would be extended to the Gentiles was, in their estimation, pure blasphemy. In indignation, they rose up against Jesus. They drove him outside the city limits and sought to cast him down, but he escaped unscathed. The lot of the prophet is a dismal one.

Saint Blase

St Blase, Bishop of Sebaste



St. Blase was a native of the city of Sebaste, in Armenia, and in his younger days applied himself to the study of philosophy, in which he made considerable progress; he afterwards studied medicine with great success. The science of the saints, however, and a desire to improve in the love of God, occupied his principal attention, whereby being inflamed with an ardent charity towards the poor, he went frequently to relieve them in their sickness. Upon the death of the bishop, his fellow citizens unanimously elected him their pastor, by reason of his extraordinary virtues and great learning.

He accepted the office, as being unwilling to resist the will of God, which appeared to manifest in his election to be mistaken; but in the government of his church he lost not that spirit of holy retirement which he had had from his youth. He therefore retired to Mount Argeus, without the city, and dwelt in a cave there. During our saint's residence in this place the Lord was pleased to manifest his sanctity by honoring him with the gift of miracles, and numerous crowds of persons used constantly to come to him for the cure of their bodily diseases as well as of their spiritual maladies. Even the most ferocious animals are said to have proceeded to his cave to be relieved. If they found the saint in prayer, they would patiently wait until he was done; nor would they depart until they had received his blessing.

FROM THE VOCATIONS DIRECTOR:

Consider This:

We currently have 58 active Diocesan Priests in our diocese (under the age of retirement of 75). We have 88 churches in our diocese. At the present moment we have 6 men preparing to become priests for our diocese. If these men all persevere they will be ordained by the year 2023. However, by that same year at least 14 of our active priests will reach the age of retirement. That is a net loss of 8, which does not take into account extraordinary circumstances like unexpected deaths, etc. These are the numbers we face in our diocese, and everyone will be affected by the dwindling number of diocesan priests here in Altoona-Johnstown. Ultimately, a call to priesthood is God's grace, but we need to cooperate with that grace! All clergy and laity must be challenged to do vocational work in their own ministries and parish communities and not rely on others to do it for them!

If we are not actively seeking new vocations to the priesthood, how do we expect these numbers to change for the better?


