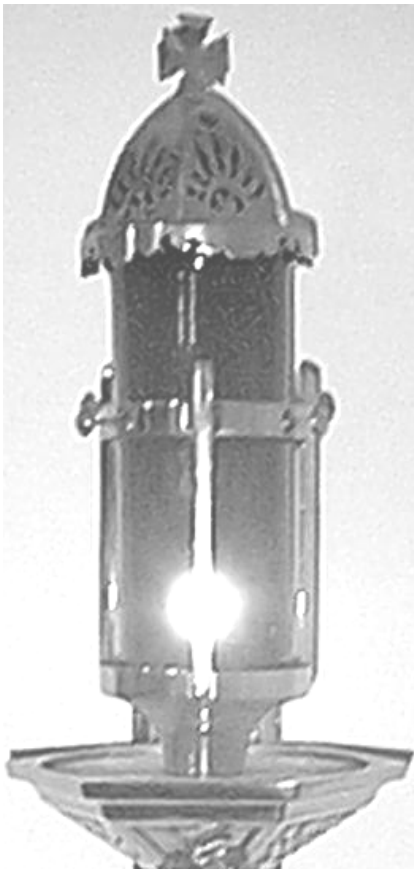

Get More Out of Mass - Adore the Blessed Sacrament Outside of Mass!

The ultimate highlight of our life as Catholics is when we receive the Eucharist at Mass. It is at that moment when we are most intimately in communion with God, experiencing a taste of Heaven, a foreshadowing of what it will be like when by God's grace we one day enter into the life that never ends with the Holy Trinity. But is your experience at Mass a little chilly? Does it leave you with something to be desired? Are distractions getting between you and a true experience of communion?

St. Augustine said, "No one partakes of this Flesh before he has adored it." The experience of receiving Communion is so brief. To make the most of that fleeting moment, prepare yourself to receive Him by spending time in Adoration. Adoring the Blessed Sacrament heightens our senses to perceive the Real Presence, the Real Jesus. After receiving Him at Mass, spend time in prayer in His Presence, reflecting on the gift you have received, asking Him to transform your life through the power of the Eucharist. He is waiting for you in the Tabernacle.

Keeping up with O.L.F. Teenagers

HELP A FRIEND

The first leading cause of deaths among 15- to 19- year olds is accidents of all kinds , including automobile. Many accidents, especially with new drivers, are caused by inexperience. Many, too, are caused by drivers who have had too much to drink.

How can you help reduce the number of accidents among your peers?

- If you notice a friend driving carelessly, don't get into a car with him or her. Let the driver know why you refuse to drive with him or her. Express concern for the driver's safety. Encourage your friends to improve driving skills, to be attentive and cautious. Praise good drivers.
- As a passenger in a friend's car be sure not to cause any form of distraction to the driver. Rough play, arguments, teasing and unnecessary physical activity during the ride can cause accidents.
- Never get into a car if you are not sure of the driver's physical condition. Make sure your driver is not over-tired or inebriated. If the driver is not in condition to drive and there is no replacement, make other arrangements for transportation.

The second leading cause of deaths among young people today is suicide. In the last three decades the suicide rate among young people has tripled. Surveys show that approximately 40% of all high school students have thought about taking their lives. Some are more serious than others.

If anyone you know even mentions that he or she has had thoughts of suicide, it should be taken very seriously. There is evidence that those who talk about suicide may seriously be considering it.

How can you help?

- Seek advice from a professional. Depending upon the situation, perhaps a doctor, priest, counselor or someone recommended by a local crisis center can help. Let the professional know about your concern for your friend or family member.
- Many communities now have suicide prevention and intervention programs. Find out where a person in trouble can get help. Arrange for help for your friend.
