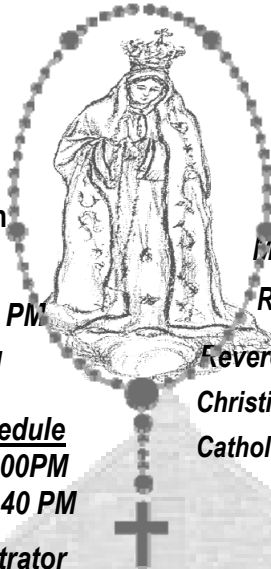

Scripture Reflection

What is true wisdom? The Book of Wisdom, written in Greek about 100 BC, conveys the spirituality of Judaism after the exile and focuses on divine wisdom. Today's passage is part of a prayer for wisdom. Wisdom is personified in Scripture as a divine figure who comes from God to guide us. "Therefore I prayed," says the Wisdom of Solomon, "and understanding was given me; I called on God, and the spirit of wisdom came to me." We are told that wisdom must be valued above all human gains—"I preferred her to scepters and thrones, and I accounted wealth as nothing in comparison with her"—but that with wisdom "all good things came to me along with her, and in her hands uncounted wealth." In today's Gospel, a man questions Jesus about eternal life. Both the question and the answer involve action, not just belief. Initially, Jesus reminds him of the commandments, and yet the man wishes for more. So Jesus lovingly invites him to give up everything, to count God as his all, and then come follow him. This is the ultimate path of wisdom, looking only to God for our way of life. However, the man goes away sad, still tied to his possessions. The man wants to belong to God, to inherit eternal life, but is unable to let all of his security rest in God's promises. We are challenged to consider how much our faith lies in God and how much in our possessions. Peter reminds Jesus that the disciples have already given up everything, probably referring to their boats, nets, and life as they knew it. The answer affirms the disciples' choice and reinforces Jesus' message to give up everything for the sake of him and the Gospel. The last line in this reading holds a surprise. Not only will the disciples receive a hundredfold of goods and relations, but also persecutions. This word sharpens the radical force of Jesus' teaching—to hand over everything to God, even our sense of well-being, trusting in his ultimate plan.

Pray for true wisdom. How do you describe the wise person?

Liturgical Reflection...

***General
 Instruction
 of the
 Roman Missal***

The dignity of the Word of God requires a suitable place in the church from which it may be proclaimed and toward which the attention of the faithful naturally turns during the Liturgy of the Word. It is appropriate that the ambo be stationary and not movable. The ambo is located in keeping with the design of each church in such a way that the ministers of God's word may be clearly seen and heard by all in the church. The dignity of the ambo requires that only a minister of the word should stand at it.
