## **The Catholic Bishops of the United States have declared that October is to be observed as Respect Life Month, and that the first Sunday of October [*next week*] is to be observed as Respect Life Sunday.**

Our Lady of Fatima Parish will cooperate with the bishops by having an additional Mass on Sunday, October 6 at 3:00 P.M. As we have done in the past we will affix an altar top to the beautiful pro life marble monument in Saint Peter and Paul's Cemetery.

The Mass will fulfill the Sunday Obligation, but attendance at two Masses on this special Sunday will constitute a fitting demonstration of Catholic commitment to Human Life. It is also a grand opportunity to assert that even though we sometimes work together, non-Catholic anti-abortion activists and Catholic Pro-life campaigners are substantially very different entities. When we Catholics speak of Pro-Life we are talking about abortion as only one of six or maybe ten activities which are almost equally immoral in God's eyes. Once non-Catholics yell "no more abortions," they pretty much have to leave the parade. Catholics have to keep marching and demonstrating against all that Gay stuff, all forms of artificial contraception, euthanasia, butchering babies to be used for spare parts or tinkering with pre-borns to create designer children and so much more.

The last time we did this we brought those wooden chairs from the garage. They proved to be hazardous to our health. They're just not sturdy enough for the cemetery's rather rough terrain. Some of the folks were wise enough to bring their own lawn chairs which proved to be both safe and comfortable. Learn from our mistakes!

Don't bring any food stuff that can't easily be distributed for take-home.
